Herbicide Treatments – On **Monday, Oct 31** and **Tuesday, Nov 1** starting at about **9am**, herbicide treatments are scheduled. The front of homes will be completed first and then back. Areas are safe for pets about one hour after treatment (when the treatment has dried). The schedule is as follows:

- Monday, Oct 31: John D Ryan Blvd, The Gardens, Large Grass Area Near 1100s and 1200s, areas around Freedom House, Dog Park and surrounding areas, Golf Range, area around small pond near 2000s, and grassy areas at Lobby Entrance
- Tuesday, Nov 1: The Oaks and The Lakes

A map of areas to be treated, as well as detailed information of the herbicides, is available at the Front Desk.

Safety Article: Red Reflector Program – If you have vision problems, hearing problems, or feel you would need special assistance to evacuate your residence in an emergency, Resident Services will arrange for a red reflector to be placed outside your home, this reflector is an indicator to emergency personnel. Part of the criteria to be an Independent Living resident is that you must be able to evacuate independently in an emergency; however, assistance with a cane, walker, or scooter is acceptable. If you utilize an assistive device that may slow your evacuation, please let Resident Services know NOW (or at any time your situation changes), so we may alert emergency personnel. In the Towers, a red reflector is placed next to your door near the floor (in the hallway) and in the stairwell, there is a list, by apartment, of current residents. Those who may require extra assistance during evacuation are annotated with a red dot. For outside residences, the reflector is placed adjacent to the Front Door.

Med Center Transportation Requests Outside Our "Normal" Zone – If you need to go to a location outside the BST shuttle "coverage" area, you may submit an exception. A committee comprised of the Resident Services Directors of both BSTE and BSTW, as well as the Dispatcher, will review and respond to your request. Forms are available at the Front Desk and should be turned in to the Resident Services Director at your Campus.

Time Change – Time to "fall back" and set your clocks back one hour before you go to bed on Saturday, Nov 5 or first thing when you get up on Sunday, Nov 6.

Stranger Danger? – If you ever see someone you don't recognize on campus and you are concerned, please contact the Front Desk immediately. It's probably a guest or contractor, but we'll respond and make a positive ID.



Transportation Costs – Ever wonder how we compute charges for transportation? We charge \$2 per mile per vehicle (covering gas/bus maintenance), \$15 per hour for each driver for trips that fall within normal business hours, and \$22 per hour, per driver, for after-hours trips. There is a higher amount for drivers after hours because we have to pay them overtime for the trip. We combine these two amounts and divide it among the number of residents who went on the trip. This way, only the people who signed up for the trip absorb the costs, i.e., it doesn't fall to other residents.

A Tip About Tips (and Other Personal Gifts) – Please note that BST employees are prohibited from accepting personal cash gifts, which includes checks, gift cards, debit cards, and tips, and personal gifts of any kind from residents or their family members or guests. (Please speak with Resident Services regarding further details.) Residents can show their appreciation either through:

- The Employee Appreciation Fund, which recognizes all <u>hourly</u>, <u>non-exempt</u> Blue Skies employees, or
- The Employee Emergency Fund, which provides financial assistance to <u>any full-time or part-time</u> Blue Skies employee who has experienced a catastrophic situation which has caused hardship beyond his or her control.

Note: Beauticians are allowed to receive personal tips for their services from residents because they are ineligible to benefit from the Employee Appreciation Fund.

GENERAL ELECTION EARLY VOTING

Early voting has begun for the upcoming **Tuesday**, **Nov 8** Joint General, Special, Charter and Bond Elections, and closes on **Friday**, **Nov 4**.

The nearest early voting sites for BSTW residents are the Johnston Library, 6307 Sun Valley Road or the Northwest Vista College, Pecan Hall, 3535 N. Ellison Drive. Otherwise, another early voting site in Bexar County may be chosen.

Early voting hours:

Friday, Oct 28 8am-6pm Sunday, Oct 30 noon-6pm

Saturday, Oct 29 8am-8pm Monday, Oct 31 - Friday, Nov 4 8am-8pm

If you have received your mail ballot, complete it and mail it in right away. If you have not received your mail ballot, you can still vote at any voting site. Just advise the clerk at the voting site that you have not received your mail ballot and want to vote. They will cancel your mail ballot request and allow you to vote.

When you have mailed your ballot to Bexar County Elections Office, in a few days, you may check the status of your ballot at bexar.org/elections.

You can participate by placing a check (please use checks instead of cash) into the slot marked "Employee Appreciation Fund" at the Front Desk or by making arrangements with Finance for a specific amount to be added to your monthly service statement. These funds are distributed twice a year (near the beginning of June and December) to all qualifying, hourly-paid employees (except for the Beauty Salon employees, the only employees allowed to receive tips). Your check must be received at the Front Desk no later than **Tuesday, Nov 22 by noon** to be counted in the upcoming distribution; otherwise, they will be applied to the mid-2023 amount. Checks should be made **payable to AFVCF** or Air Force Villages Charitable Foundation with "Employees' Appreciation Fund" on the comment line. Thank you.


ROARING '20s EXTRAVAGANZA

GREAT COURSES DISCUSSION GROUP






This course is presented in a series of video lectures by
