On 25 October with minimal publicity, the underestimated strength of Hurricane "Otis" with 165 mph winds demolished all communications, and unleashed a nightmare scenario in Acapulo, Mexico, the home to roughly 800 thousand people. After three weeks of recovery, Amateur Radio Operators are still needed, and remain actively involved in multiple operations to include providing information to state agencies; accomplishing requests to obtain information about relatives; and relaying survivors' messages to individuals regarding their status. Access to many areas remain a challenge due to debris blocking travel. Some Amateur Radio Operators are still operating their equipment on battery power, while others have access to generators. Thank you, Amateur Radio Operators, for always being available instantly to provide needed communication during disasters. came from the Herb Garden. At a recent discussion, during Coffee with the Chef, one of the questions was, how often does the kitchen use herbs from the garden, The Chef answered "every day".



Shown in the picture is the planter in the patio outside of CC-3 which is in full production of Parsley(foreground), Thyme, Chives,

Oregano, Thai Basil and Basil, both heavily harvested, and Mint. All are labeled for identification. In addition to this planter are two planters outside CC-1 One of which has some Thyme, Sage, and Basil.

Rains just after planting flooded that planter destroying over 100 plants forestalling full production because funds were not available to replace the ones that were flooded. A third Planter has Jalapeño and cayenne peppers.
