It has been a long-standing tradition for Blue Skies residents to express an additional “Thank You” through the Employee Appreciation Fund. Your gifts qualify as donations to the Air Force Villages Charitable Foundation, and as such, they will be included in your annual statement of donations. You can participate by placing a check (please use checks instead of cash) into the slot marked “Employee Appreciation Fund” at the Front Desk, or by making arrangements with Finance for a specific amount to be added to your Monthly Service Statement. These funds are distributed twice a year (near the beginning of June and December) to all qualifying hourly-paid employees (with the exception of Beauty Salon employees, the only employees allowed to receive tips). Your check must be received at the Front Desk no later than Friday, **May 31** by the end of the day. Checks should be made payable to Air Force Villages Charitable Foundation (or its initials, AFVCF) and marked for Employees’ Appreciation Fund. Thank you.

Resident Services Announcements

This Spring don't let Scammers Spring One on You... ~ Ashlie Maltos

Scammers posing as Spectrum are targeting customers with a 50% discount offer on their monthly bill for cable services over a 12-month period, which can only be activated by purchasing Target Gift Cards. This is part of a known fraud scam targeting Spectrum customers. Using all lines of communication, from text messages to phone calls and emails, scammers are offering to reduce your service cost by 50% for this Target Gift Card Offer Fraud Scheme. It may sound convincing, but it's not a valid offer from Spectrum. Spectrum will never ask you to pay your bill by gift cards (e.g. Target gift card), wire transfer, cryptocurrency, payment apps (Venmo, Zelle, CashApp, PayPal), or offer a discounted rate for a fee.



What you should do: Avoid responding to any text messages, phone calls and/or emails that sound "too good to be true". Never provide your personal account or payment information.

Here's how it works:

1. The scammer contacts you by SMS (text) or voicemail, posing as Spectrum and stating they have applied a 50% discount to your monthly bill.
2. The scammer will direct you to a phone number to call for you to keep the 50% discount offer.
3. Once you respond by calling the number, you'll be greeted by a live fraudster representative, who will ask you for the mobile phone number that received the text or voice call and your account information.
4. The scammer then will contact Spectrum Customer Care posing as you and using the info you provided to retrieve your Spectrum account billing information.
5. The scammer will then provide you with your account balance and present the 50% offer on cable services over a 12-month period, which can only be activated by purchasing a Target Gift Card or VISA Reward Card.
6. The scammer will direct you to ANY convenience store to make this purchase.
7. If you agree to this offer, you will receive a SMS communication on how to provide the Target Gift Card information to a fraudulent "Third-Party Vendor" to fulfill the agreement.
8. At this point, you'll have been scammed out of your money, as well as involved in a Gift Card scam.

Red Hat Luncheon ~ Vivian Ray

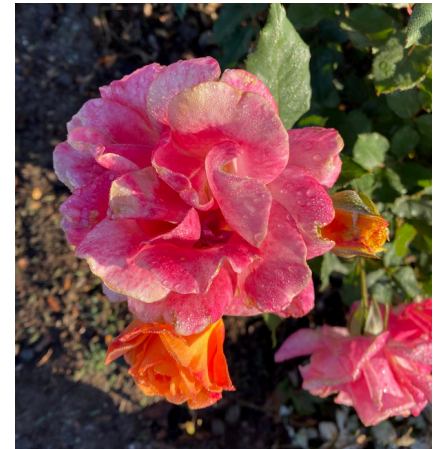

The roses were in full bloom and beautiful.



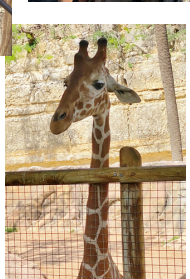
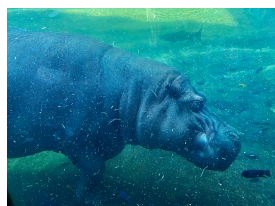

Wear a Poppy on National Poppy Day and Memorial Day ~ Ginny Callanan

Traditional red crepe paper poppies were made by our Veterans to honor those who were killed in WWI. Congress established National Poppy Day in 1924 as the Friday before Memorial Day – Friday, **May 24** this year. Subsequently, it has been expanded to honor all of those who served and died in any of our wars. How did the poppy, classified as a weed, become a national symbol of sacrifice for those who died in our wars? The poppy was the inspiration for the famous poem "In Flanders Fields" written by Lt Col John McCrae, a Canadian doctor who served on the front lines in WWI. He was struck by the sight of the resilient red poppies growing amidst the carnage of the fallen on the desolate battlefields. If you read the poem, visualize the poppies as a soldier's war reflections, and in the last verse the fallen soldier's expectations for us to continue their fight for our country.

Volunteers will have poppies available (in the lobby, outside the dining room, and other locations) for all the residents and staff on Thursday and Friday, **May 23 and 24**. If you would like to make a donation, you may do so when you get your poppy. All the donations will go to the San Antonio non-profit "Military Warrior Support Foundation" for their programs to support combat-wounded veterans and Gold Star spouses/families.

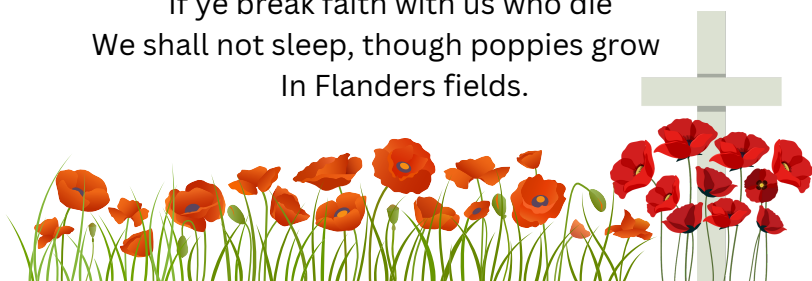

Resident of the Month

In August 2021, Jack Church commenced his journey on our Residence Council when he replaced Jack Briggs as his area representative. At Jack's first meeting as an area representative, he addressed issues concerning residents' work orders, the status of decorative ponds, and praised the library volunteer staff. His service and community concerns led to his unanimous approval to serve as the RC Vice Chair in 2022. Upon Stet Reid's termination, Jack volunteered to run for the 2023 RC Chairperson. He was unopposed and was unanimously approved. His first



meeting as the RC Chair revealed his expectations in his initial presentation: "Outlook 2023 for the RC", which stressed that the RC is the voice of the residents stating: "We are here to serve all residents." He encouraged residents to improve our Village environment by walking around, and if we see a problem, we should try to fix it, or initiate a work order so management can fix it. Under Jack's leadership, the RC Bylaws, Policies and Procedures were revised; the "Challenge/Commemorative Coin" initiative was started; residents were polled for their preference for guest speakers; and residents were encouraged to complete the "Resident Survey". Jack loves music, is very social, and enjoys entertaining others. 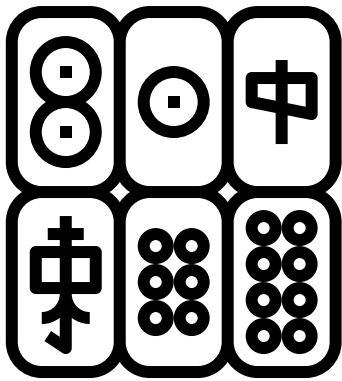
